



## **Pupil Premium Grant Allocation and Expenditure for Redden Court School**

The Pupil Premium Grant is received in addition to our main school budget, to address the variation in equality, opportunity and achievement between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers. From the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2012, the eligibility criteria changed to include any student who has been eligible for FSM in the last 6 years (known as 'EVER 6'). Redden Court School will also receive funding to support children who have been continuously CLA for more than six months and children of service personnel. These children are now known collectively as 'disadvantaged' children.

The key purpose to the allocation and targeted spending of this grant is to address the inequalities and raise the attainment of students from low income families.

### **Redden Court School's approach to 'Closing and Eliminating the Gap'.**

At Redden Court School we believe that the use of the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) should be linked to our School Development Plan (SDP) and concentrate on 3 of the 4 key areas in the new Ofsted framework.





These 3 areas underpin our school's ethos of aspiration and a Commitment to Success for all students. In the case of the PPG, our spending is focused on improving provision for these students in these 3 areas.

### **Pupil Premium Expenditure for 2015-16**

For the 2015-16 academic year the school received £160,000 in pupil premium funding which was spent in the following way.
